

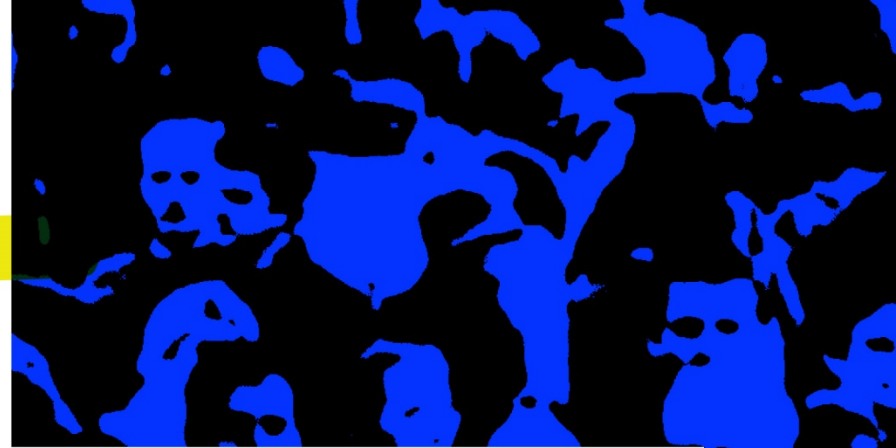

Community model



Practical emphasis

- Relevance of each professional role
- Indicators which may show a radicalisation process
- Do's and, perhaps even more importantly, Don'ts

Do

- Be aware that changes may be caused by radicalisation;
- Make contact with professional networks within your area;
- Support positive identity formation;
- Where possible, support family members;
- Make sure that any reports of discrimination are dealt with thoroughly and fairly;
- Raise awareness about propaganda methods.

Don't (ever)

- Intervene in a law enforcement capacity unless you are sure, also based on information from other professionals around the individual, that there is reason to do so. You may make a problem worse, or even create a problem where none exists.
- Assume that conversion to a religious or political cause is automatically a cause for concern.
- Make an individual feel singled out for special (negative) attention.
