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

# Project Background


#### Methods:

- Interviews (19 experts)
- Site Visits (2) -- Chillicothe, Ohio & Atlanta, Georgia

Site	Population	Race		Drug overdose deaths (2017)	Drug overdose death rate (2017)
Chillicothe, Ohio	21,698	85.9% 7.0% 0.5% 5.9%	White Black Asian Two or more	28 (Ross County)	36.2
Atlanta, Georgia	498,044	40.1% 52.3% 4.0% 2.3%	White Black Asian Two or more	164 (Fulton County)	15.7
United States	327,167,434	76.5% 13.4% 5.9% 2.7%	White Black Asian Two or more	70,236	21.7



# **Emerging Policing Strategies**





### Chillicothe: Post Overdose Response Team

#### **Team Composition**

• Law enforcement (police and sheriff's office), district health staff, treatment providers, Hope Partnership Project coordinator

#### **Team Objectives**

- Review weekly overdoses
- Provide post overdose response
  - Naloxone
  - Connections to treatment
  - Information for family members

### Chillicothe: Post Overdose Response Team

#### **Successes**

- Capitalizes on natural connection police have with community
- "Culture change" with law enforcement
  - Reframed perceptions about the role of law enforcement in responding to overdoses

#### **Challenges**

- Police officer is the lead of the response team rather than a harm reduction outreach worker
  - Potential to limit engagement due to mistrust



# Atlanta: Pre-Arrest Diversion (PAD)

#### Origins in community organizing

 Coalition to support Black transgender and gender nonconforming sex workers in Midtown Atlanta

#### **Pre-Arrest**

- *Before* an arrest is made
- Officer initiates diversion and is met at scene by PAD case
   management team
- 118 diversions over last two years

"We were not doing jails. We were about healthcare, not handcuffs."

- Marilyn Winn, Women on the rise

#### **Housing First/Harm Reduction philosophy**

- No conditions for engaging in services
- Do not stop working with people when they experience set backs

"We're really trying to do that reframing ...
bringing the harm reduction framework
into every conversation we are having
with all these partners."

### **Atlanta: Pre-Arrest Diversion**

#### **Successes**

- 118 diversion to date (October 2017 June 2019)
- Diversions made by 43 different officers
- Building new collaborations/new culture

"It gave me time to stop worrying about other things, where I could take care of business and start getting things right ..."

-- PAD partiicpant

#### Challenges

- Reach versus need & challenges to scaling
- Model relies on police discretion

"You have to make a judgment call. You want to make a diversion when it makes sense."

-- Atlanta Police Officer

#### Different models, different goals?

- Justice-system-led versus community-led
- No social contact referrals
- Ultimate goal of decriminalization



# The role of police in the matrix of harm reduction

- Meeting police where they are and making them less a source of harm
- Disengtangling justice and health systems
- Viewing program creation and implementation through a racial equity lens
- Pushing the conversation about how we define harm reduction and recovery
