



How?

- Use available data, information and intelligence
- Dovetail into existing support and treatment frameworks

PUT PEOPLE BEFORE PROCESS



Case study 1

23 year old male presented at hospital following alcohol and drug intoxication

- Two days later taken to hospital by ambulance after being found unresponsive in public toilet following overdose
- Week later drug related death





Assertive Outreach

Intelligence cell identifies individual at high risk of harm from substance use NHS triages, identifies relevant treatment/support services and develops Anticipatory Care plan

Engagement team makes approach, secures buy-in and guides into appropriate service





Case study 2

41 year old former paratrooper descended into heroin use after leaving the forces. Suffered overdose, Naloxone administered. Unknown to police/not registered with GP.

- Engaged by Op Threshold
- Food parcels arranged/day to day needs addressed
- Linked in with support and prescribed Suboxone
- Currently free from illicit drugs and seeking training/employment
- Credits the Op Threshold intervention with "saving his life"





Case study 3


42 year old male encountered during enforcement activity. Apparent he was being exploited by dealers and his flat was being used as 'shooting gallery', but did not see himself as a victim or in need of help.

- Extensive Op Threshold engagement to build trust and secure buy-in
- Case conference to establish which partners best placed to support
- House move facilitated
- Access to ORT expedited
- Intensive ongoing support







Conclusions

- Public space overdose indicator of potential tipping point for DRD
- Person and outcome focused approach key to successful engagement and relationship building
- Engagement and support welcomed in majority of cases
- Format provides a workable model on which partners will build to enrich picture and bolster outreach capacity and capability – providing required services at point of need
