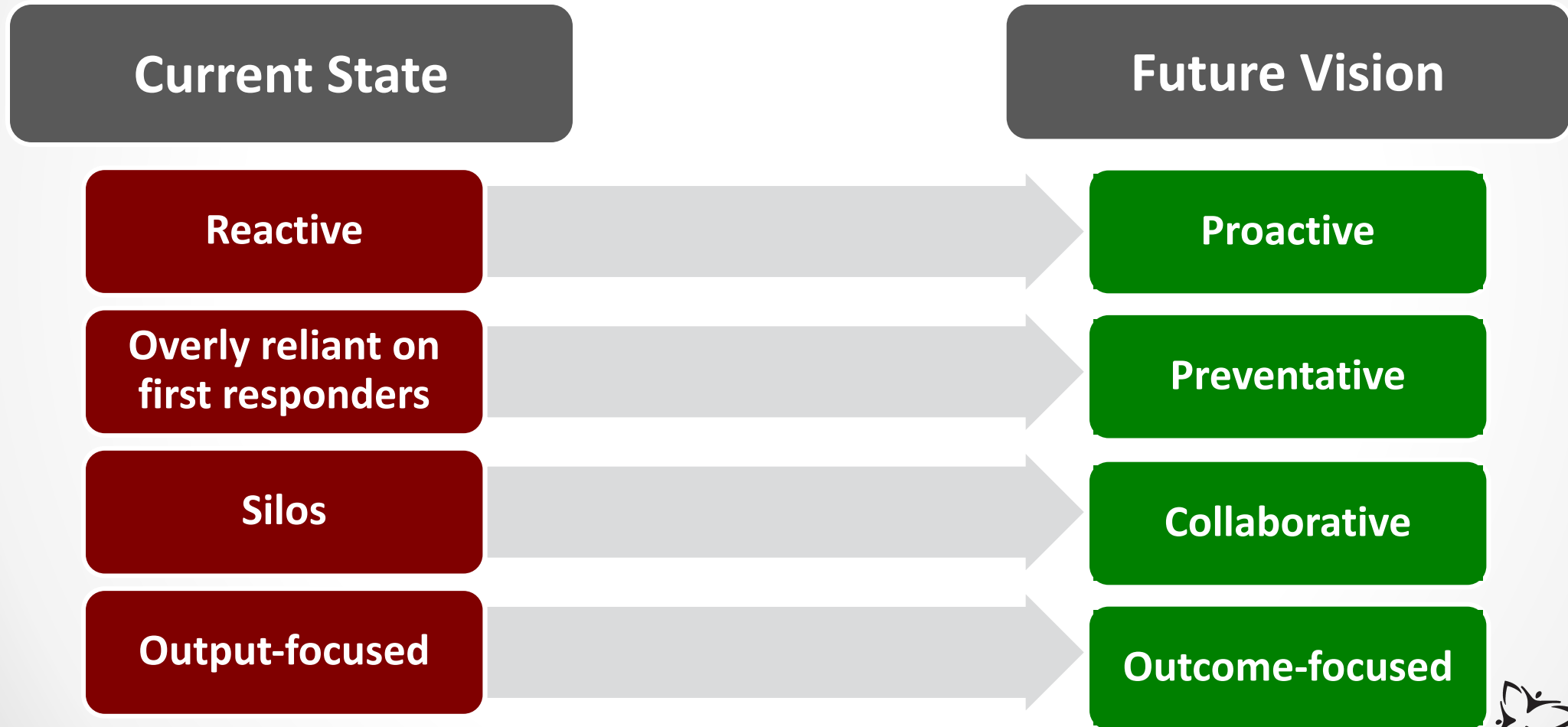

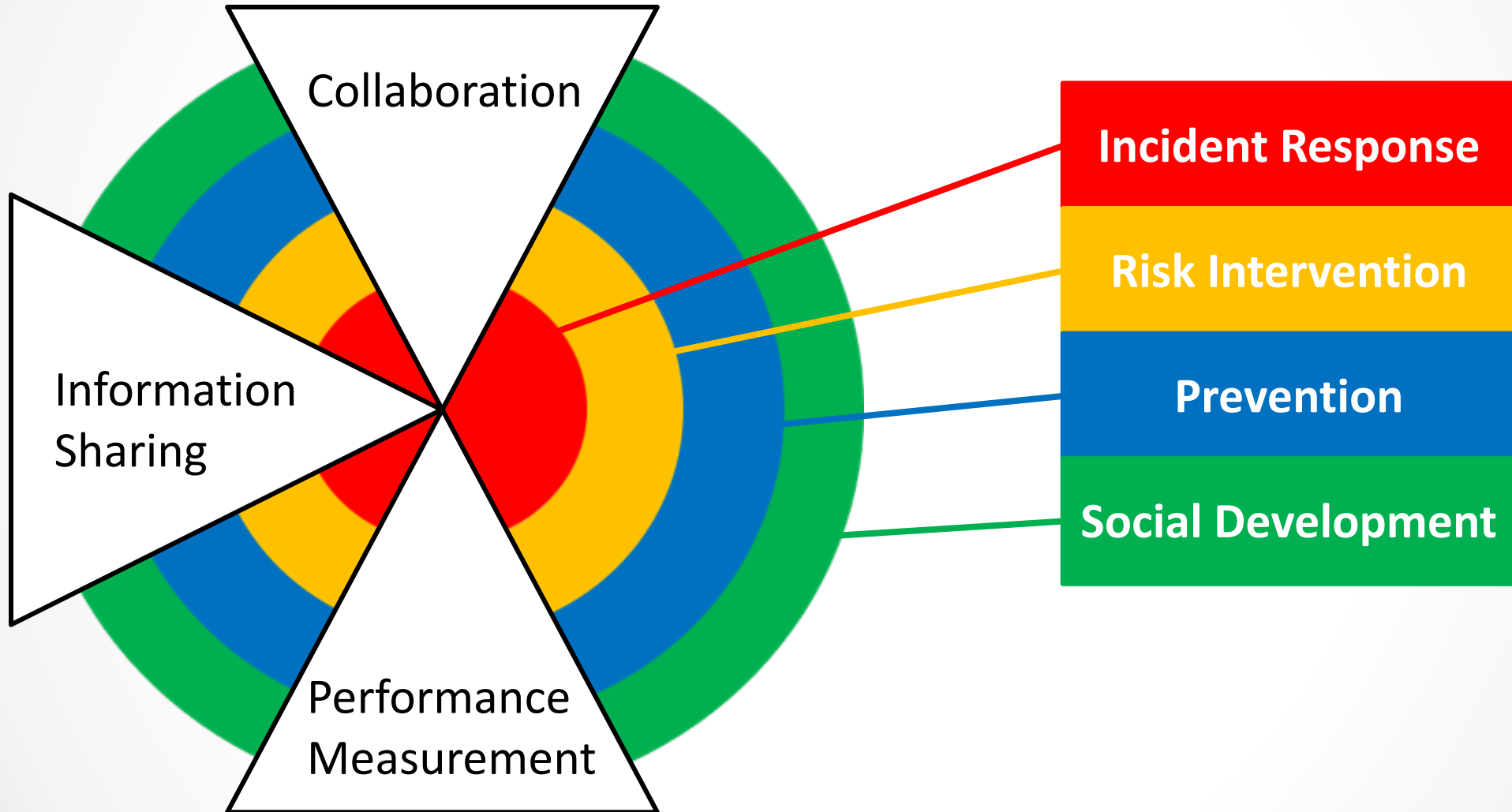

Community Safety and Well-Being Planning Framework



Incident Response

Critical and non-critical incidents requiring first responders (e.g., police, fire)

Significant time and resources

Police as the primary response to persons in crisis

Long wait times in hospital emergency departments

Risk Intervention

Prevent harm before critical or non-critical response is required

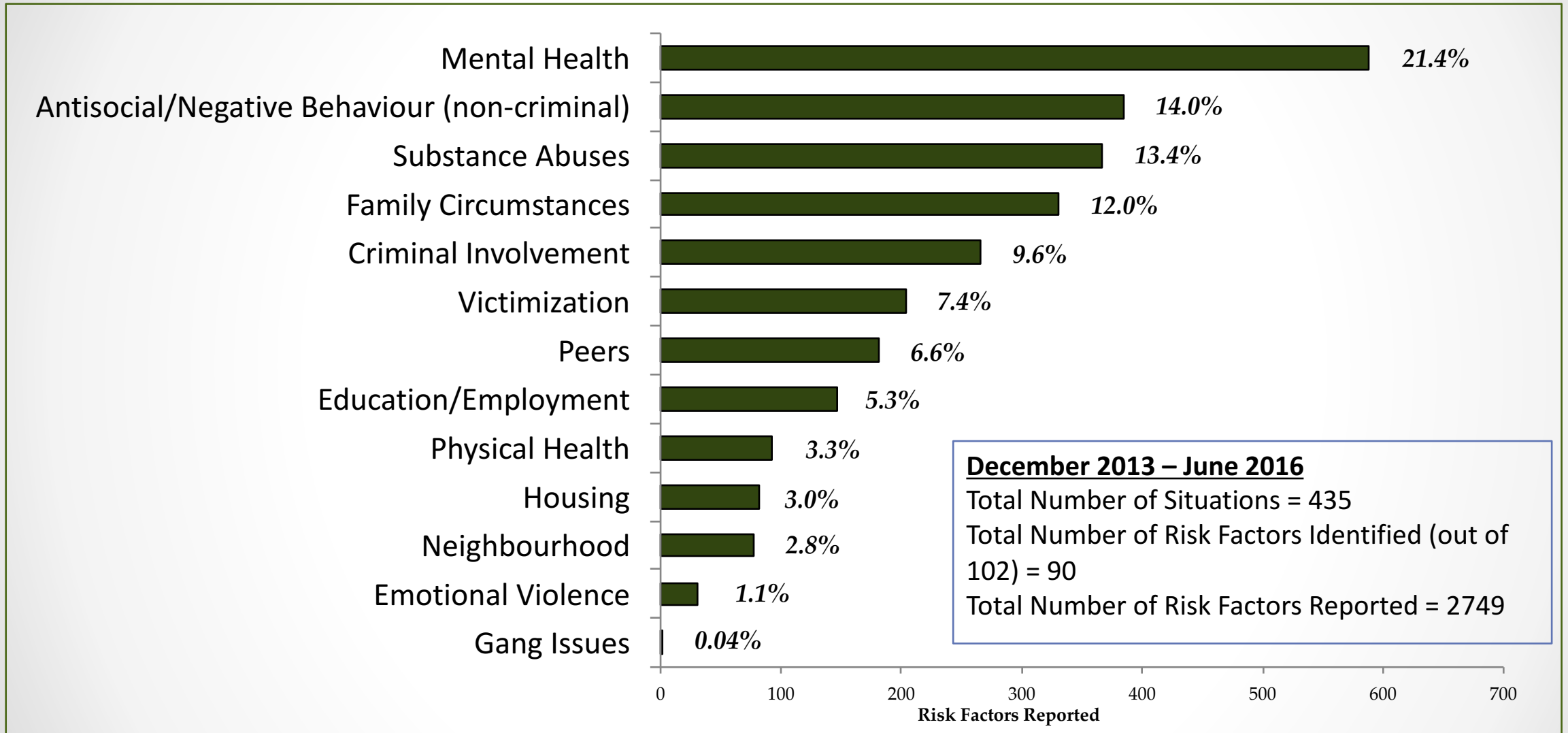
Mitigate situations of elevated risk

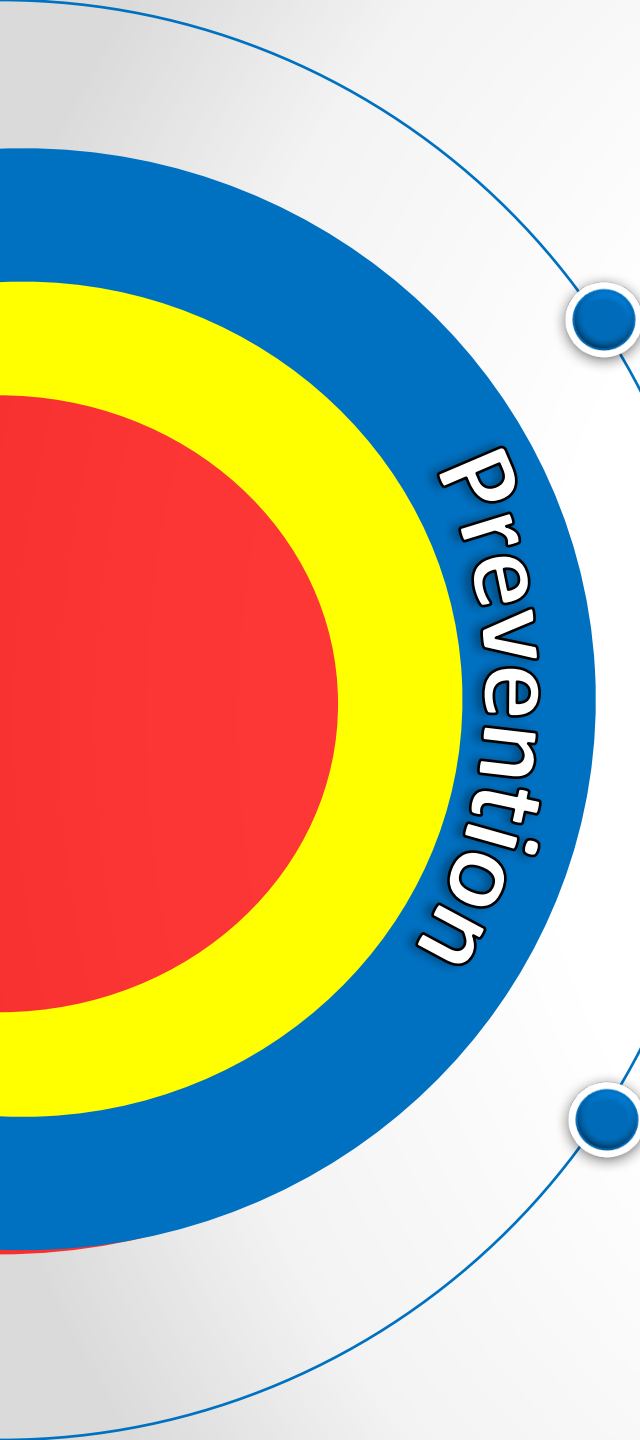
Implement immediate multi-sector responses (e.g., Situation Tables)

Collect risk-based data [e.g., Risk-driven Tracking Database (RTD)]

Prevention

Address locally-identified risk factors before they escalate

Use RTD data to inform evidence-based programs/policies

Implement collaborative programs that address priority issues for vulnerable groups

Engage non-traditional groups



Social Development

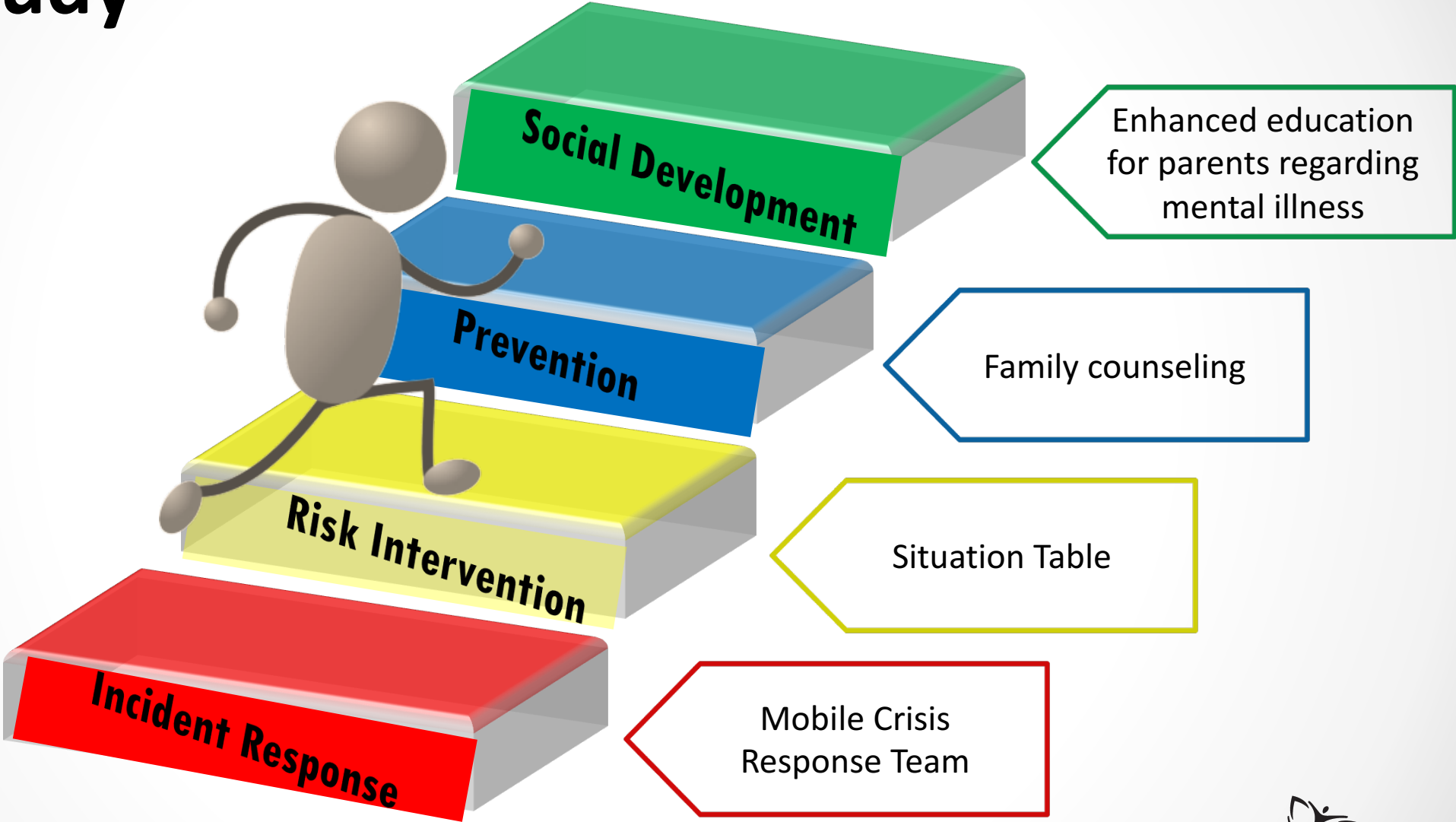
Long-term investment to improve the social determinants of health

Address complex social issues using a cross-sectoral approach (e.g., poverty)

Ensure awareness of/access to services in the community

Challenge institutional boundaries and organizational culture
