1. A decade of systematic research

Resilience process refers to concrete functioning in critical circumstances

- Biological processes (physical)
- Psychological processes (mental)
- Moral processes (spiritual)
- Group dynamics



2. How to explore the policing paradox

Two different types of resilience emerge:


- Being tough: resistance (closed mental shielding)
- Being receptive: sensitivity (open moral meaning)

Closing or opening...?

- -> How do police officers shield against threat and confrontation in complex interactions?
- -> How do police officers manage to be sensitive in complex interactions?

Are shielding (closing) and sensitizing (opening) related?
Properties of semi permeability...?



Application: operational context of police work

-> Focus on interaction supervisor – recruit (socialisation process)
